

College Prep Scholarship

FOR HIGH SCHOOL JUNIORS



The College Prep Scholarship for high school juniors provides opportunities that help talented low-income students understand an education at a top college can be both possible and affordable —and provides resources to help them get there.

HOW IS IT POSSIBLE?

Leading colleges are specifically looking for students who have achieved academic excellence despite facing economic hardship. These students often don't realize that their academic success qualifies them for admission to top schools, and that the schools have enough funding to make it possible for them to attend affordably, if not for free.

HOW IS IT AFFORDABLE?

Because financial aid at these schools covers 100% of students' demonstrated financial need, attending a highly selective college can actually be less expensive than going to a community or state college. Often, lowincome families do not need to contribute at all.

COLLEGE PREP SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

Through one FREE application, students who are selected as College Prep Scholars may receive one or more of the following awards:

Full scholarships to college summer programs

Approximately 40 students will receive full scholarships to summer school programs at Brandeis, Emory, Harvard, Notre Dame, Penn, Stanford, and Yale. The scholarship will cover the cost of travel, tuition, and room & board.

National College Admissions Conference invitation

More than 2,000 students will be invited to attend one of our conferences held at our partner colleges, where students will learn about how to successfully apply to leading colleges as a high-achieving, low-income student and will interact with admissions officers.

One-on-one college admissions counseling

More than 60 students will be paired with a trained counselor for individualized admissions guidance.

All-expense-paid college visit

At least 100 students will be nominated to have travel expenses and room & board covered by a QuestBridge partner college to visit their campus.

Telementoring with college students

Approximately 300 students will be paired with Amherst College students who have been trained in providing admissions advice to low-income students.



Mid-February: College Prep Scholarship becomes available



Late March: College Prep Scholarship due



Late April: College Prep Scholars selected; applicants notified



August: College Match application becomes available

Applicants to our College Prep Scholarship program are well-prepared to apply to the National College Match during their senior year. Students do not need to apply to the College Prep Scholarship in order to be eligible for the College Match.

HOW TO APPLY

The College Prep Scholarship is open to high school juniors who are planning to apply to college in the fall of their senior year.

The application opens in mid-February and is due at the end of March. Fill out a free online application: www.questbridge.org.

To apply, we require:

- · Detailed academic and financial information
- Essay and short answers
- · Current high school transcript
- · Letter of recommendation from a high school teacher
- Any available standardized test scores



ELIGIBILITY

The College Prep Scholarship is open to high school juniors who have shown academic excellence despite facing long-term economic challenges.

SELECTION CRITERIA:

We review applications holistically, and consider many factors, including:

Academic Achievement: Unweighted GPA above a 3.5 in challenging courses and strong writing ability. If applicable, standardized test scores and class rank. Financial Need: Household income of less than \$60,000 per year for a typical family of four. Limited assets.
